Souls to the Polls!

Chicagoans will select a Mayor and Ward Alderpersons on Tuesday, February 28. Polls open at 6 am. Early voting begins in each Ward on February 13.

If no candidate gets more than 50% of the vote, a run-off will be held on Tuesday, April 4.

For the first time, voters will also elect 3 people in each police district to serve on the new Police District Councils. The Councils were created as part of the the Empowering Community for Public Safety Ordinance. Each Council will help hold police accountable, build community trust, and expand restorative justice.

At KANSA, we believe that Lent is an opportunity to put into practice Isaiah's "true" fasting—a fast that addresses injustice through compassion and advocacy.

This year, our Lenten Compact will focus on those who have experienced discrimination and exclusion on the basis of their sexual orientation, gender identity and gender expression. Through the 40 days and 6 Sundays of Lent, we will look at what the Bible says (and doesn't say) about those who do not fit the male/female binary and consider scientific discoveries about gender and sexual development. we'll hear the stories of those who have been condemned and rejected because of their genders.

Once again, we will offer a Lenten Book Club selection to engage the topic of inclusion. The book, A Bigger Table by John Pavlovitz, can be ordered online or through the church.

While the topic of sexuality has been divisive within the global Church, our goal is to listen, learn and (above all) love beyond the labels, remembering that God's love for the world has no limits.

On **Sunday, February 19**, we will preview the Compact as part of our hybrid worship service at 10:30 am.
